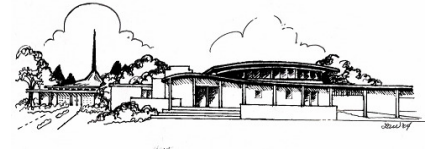

What is a Dharma Talk?

A Dharma talk is a public discourse by a Buddhist teacher. It's not likely to be about theory but about the nut and bolts of living and getting along with ourselves and others. The teachers offer concrete advice on how to proceed when we find ourselves in the grip of strong emotions and how to communicate clearly with others using deep listening and loving speech.

Laughter frequently arises as the audience members recognize themselves in the gentle offerings of the teachers. "Dharma" is a word with many meanings but a favorite is "things as they are." These talks give a clearer insight into things as they are, in their true nature that is independent of our conceptions.

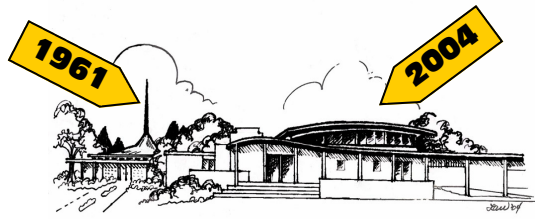

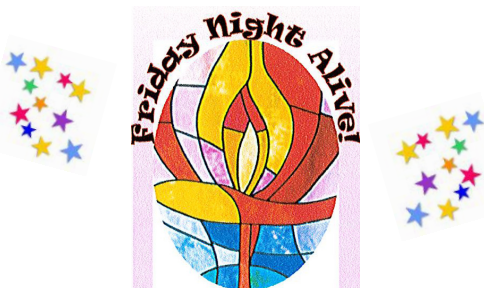
